The information about the meeting place and start time of your circuit can be found on your voucher.

Early departure from Brussels to **GHENT**, birthplace of Emperor Charles V. We will walk with our guide through its historic centre, full of medieval charms and contemporary life. We will visit the Town Hall, the Belfry, Saint Nicholas Church and Graslei Medieval Quay from St. Michael 's Bridge and we will reach the Castle of the Counts of Flanders.

We then head for **SLUIS**, a city located in the Netherlands close to the Belgian border, which has always been of great strategic importance. We will have time to stroll through its lively centre and have lunch.

We continue our stage towards one of the best-preserved medieval cities in the world: **BRUGES**. It is a quiet and welcoming city of a beauty suspended in time.



DUNKIRK

Surrounded by its walls and full of canals that will take us back to the Middle Ages, we will have time to stroll through the city centre and discover its nooks and crannies.

We will end our day in **DUNKIRK**, a port city in the north of France. Accommodation.

### Day 02 . Dunkirk-Eperlecques-Lens-Memorial de Vimy-Naours-Amiens.-

After breakfast, we will visit the centre of **Dunkirk**, France 's third largest port, a city hard hit by countless wars. During the Second World War, it was here, on its beaches, that the "Miracle of Dunkirk" took place, it was the most famous Allied retreat.

We will continue our journey through France until we reach **ÉPERLECQUES**. Located in the forest of a town, with the same name, we will visit a huge bunker from which the Germans launched missiles towards England during the Nazi era (**entrance fee included**).

Our next stop will be in **LENS**, a city badly affected by the World Wars and, later, by the decline of mining, which was its main economic activity. The city has managed to recover, an example of this is the **Louvre-Lens Museum**, built on the site of a former coal mine (**entrance fee included**).

We will also visit **the Ring of Memory**, a living museum located on the hill of Notre-Dame de Lorette where the names of the 580,000 people who died during World War I are displayed.

We will continue towards **the Vimy Memorial**, an impressive monument built by the Canadians to commemorate their 66,000 casualties during the war. We might also see part of the reconstructed trenches and tunnels.

We will arrive at **NAOURS**, an authentic underground city of Roman origin built in the III century and which was used during the two World Wars and became Nazis headquarters (**entrance fee included**).

Our last stop will be in the charming town of **AMIENS**. Accommodation.

### Day 03 . Amiens-Chateau Peronne-Saint Quentin-Reims.-

In the morning, we will have the opportunity to stroll through the streets of this charming city so full of life, standing out with its Notre-Dame Cathedral, declared a World Heritage Site. It was the scene of the Battle of Amiens, one of the important Allied offensives on the Western Front during World War I.





NAMUR

We will head towards **Château de Péronne**, a XIII century castle. Inside, we can visit the **museum of First World War**, which brings together collections of military and everyday objects from the civilian populations of Germany, France and Great Britain (**entrance fee included**).

We will continue on to another of the most famous war enclaves, **SAINT-QUENTIN**. This is where one of Philip II of Spain 's most important victories against French soldiers took place. It was part of the Hindenburg Line during World War I and was bombed in a devastating manner.

We will travel to **REIMS**, an ancient city of Roman origin where we will visit its Cathedral, one of the best Gothic cathedrals that we can see in France. We will also visit its Place Royale or royal square. Accommodation.

#### Day 04 . Reims-Rocroi-Sedan-Luxembourg.-

Early departure from Reims for **ROCROI**. The battle that took place here in 1643 marked the decline of Spanish military hegemony in Europe. Nowadays, it is a fortified town in the shape of a star. We will visit its main square and some of its fortifications.

We will continue our route to another of the most emblematic sites of the continent 's wars, **SEDAN**. Napoleon III was imprisoned there during the Franco-Prussian War. During World War II, German soldiers managed to cross the supposedly impassable Maginot Line which allowed them to invade France through Sedan. We will have time for lunch here and then, we will leave France and head for **LUXEMBOURG**. We will arrive in its lively capital, surrounded by defiant cliffs. Here, we will have time to enjoy its beautiful old town with medieval fortifications declared World Heritage Site. Accommodation.

### Day 05 . Luxembourg-Namur-Gembloux-Brussels.-

Early in the morning, we will return to Belgium to visit **NAMUR**, one of the most attractive cities in the country with its millenary fortification that crowns it, as well as the beauty of the two rivers that flow through the town. It was an important target for the Germans during the invasion of Belgium in 1914. During World War II, it was on the front line of the Battle of the Bulge in 1940 and 1944.

We will have some time to enjoy the city and then, we will go to **GEMBOUX**. It is a Belgian city known in the past for the quality of its knives. We will walk with our guide through its narrow streets from where we will see the famous bell tower of the old Saint-Sauveur church.

After lunch, we will set off to return to **BRUSSELS**. We will make a photo stop at the Atomium before arriving at the lively city centre and its Grand Place. It is a city of contrasts with XV century buildings as well as Art Nouveau architecture, where we will find the great cultural mix that characterises it.

End of services.

Our guide will take you to the airport for your return flight or take you to the point of your choice if you are continuing your holiday.



# AMSTERDAM AND NETHERLANDS

### Day 01 . Amsterdam.-

**Welcome to your Europamundo Trip Style!!!**

The information about the meeting place and start time of your circuit can be found on your voucher.

Today we will spend the day **walking around Amsterdam together with our tour guide**. We will walk through the centre of this elegant city with a fascinating history and bustling atmosphere. We will begin by taking a stroll through some of its most emblematic quarters such as the Jordaan or the Jewish quarter, crossing its numerous canals. We will then visit the **Royal Palace** at Dam Square (**entrance included**). From there, we will go to the Begijnhof district to visit the oldest house in the city which is also one of the only preserved wooden buildings. Afterwards, we will look around the Flower Market which will be full of bright colours and the scent of fresh blossoms. After a walk through this beautiful market, we will have some free time to have lunch in one of the local restaurants. In the afternoon, we will take a **boat trip through the canals (included)**, an unforgettable experience that will allow us to continue discovering the nooks and crannies of Amsterdam. We will also visit the Rembrandtplein district, a place



full of life, cafes, shops and ever-present tributes to Dutch art. Here, if you wish, we will finish our day having dinner at one of the typical restaurants. Accommodation.

## Day 02 . Amsterdam.-

We will continue discovering the city today. After a good breakfast, we will head towards one of the most emblematic places in Amsterdam, the **Van Gogh Museum**, located in Museumplein. With more than 200 works by this influential 20<sup>th</sup> century painter. Here, we will also find drawings and letters signed by the artist. The collection shows all the creative periods of the fabulous Dutch painter chronologically up to the end of his life (**entrance to the museum included**).

We will then head towards the **Red-Light District** in the heart of the city. This neighbourhood is known for being one of the most liberal places in the world regarding its attitude towards the sex and drug industries. The many neon and red lights that give the neighbourhood its name and decorate its world-famous “shop windows” are thought provoking.

In the afternoon, we will go to the dynamic **Leidseplein Square**, especially vibrant at sunset, and very popular for its bars and restaurants. Accommodation.

## Day 03 . Amsterdam - Noordwijkerhout - The Hague.-

We will leave Amsterdam early in the morning and travel to **NOORDWIJKERHOUT**. Here we will visit the **Ridder Bloemen Flower Farm (entrance included)** where we will get to know some of the facilities as well as, learn about growing tulips, the emblematic flowers of this country.

We will continue our journey to the administrative capital of the country, **THE HAGUE**. Here, we will visit **Madurodam (entrance included)**, the smallest “city” of the Netherlands, and a theme park. There, we will find numerous scale models of Dutch monuments and landmarks, as well as: trees, characters that walk through its streets, boats, trains ... all made to a scale 25 times smaller than reality.

Next, we will go to The Hague where we will have the whole afternoon to get to know the city. Some unmissable sites the famous Royal Picture Gallery Mauritshuis, the International Court of Justice, the Van Kleeff distillery (which counted with Van Gogh himself as a client) or the Museum Gevangenpoort which was once a medieval prison. Accommodation.

### Day 04 . The Hague – Delft – Kinderdijk – Rotterdam.-

A few kilometres from The Hague we find the lively university town of **DELFT**, known for its connection with the Dutch artist Johannes Vermeer, blue pottery and the Royal House. Criss-crossed by canals, this town offers a traditionally-Dutch city centre and numerous churches, mansions, museums and musical bars. We will have time to explore the city with our tour guide and visit the **Royal Delft**, a world-famous museum factory where Delft blue pottery is still hand crafted (**entrance included**).

We will continue our journey to the important port city of **ROTTERDAM**. Known as the Capital of architecture, with innovation and urban redevelopment at its focus, it also was the first in Europe to have a pedestrian-only shopping street. Free time to enjoy the authentic local cuisine if you feel like it. After lunch, we will drive to **KINDERDIJK**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, known for its iconic 18th-century windmills. We will get to visit the windmills and learn how they work and how the Dutch people have been harnessing water to their advantage for 1,000 years (**entrance included**). Later, we will return to Rotterdam to visit the “**Cube Houses**” designed by Dutch architect Piet Blom and we will get to know the city better by taking a **ride on the Splashtours** - this unique coach will take us on an amphibian tour through the city and over the waters of the Maas River (**ticket included**).

We will finish our day in the covered market of **Markthal** known, not only, for its bars, food shops and restaurants but, also, for its extraordinary architecture. Accommodation.

### Day 05 . Rotterdam – Utrecht – Giethoorn – Volendam.-

After breakfast we will be heading to the heart of the Netherlands to visit the cheerful and lively university town of **UTRECHT** and its Dom Tower, visible from any part of the city centre. We will have some time to stroll among its cafes, canals and beautiful pedestrian downtown.

Our next stop will be **GIETHOORN**, situated in the Weerribben-Wieden National Park. It is an idyllic village with a great number of thatched-roof farmhouses. They are built on small islands that can only be reached through the canals by boat (**ticket included**).

We will head north to **VOLENDAM**, an old fishermen’s village known for its charming harbour, architecture, fish trade and the authentic character of its inhabitants. We will stroll around this beautiful village for the rest of the day. **Accommodation.**

## Day 06 . Volendam – Marken – Alkmaar - Zaanse Schans – Amsterdam.-

We will spend the morning rambling through Volendam. Afterwards, we will continue our tour towards traditional villages in the north of the country. Get ready to immerse yourselves in the authentic Dutch culture! The first village we will visit is **MARKEN**, which we will reach by **boat (included)**. Once there, we will be able to walk around this idyllic peninsula and admire its little wooden houses. Our next small town is **ALKMAAR**, considered “the city of cheese”. It contains a wonderful old town full of monuments, a pleasant shopping area and lots of terraces, cafes and restaurants of all kinds. We will continue our tour by visiting **ZAANSE SCHANS**, a real outdoor museum where Dutch craftsmen live and work. Here, visitors can learn about Dutch culture, mills, clogs, crafts and bakery among others.

After exploring this beautiful town, we will return to Amsterdam where we will end our journey around this beautiful country. **Arrival and end of services.** Our guide will drop you off at the agreed point.



### Day 01 . Bordeaux- Pauillac- Lamarque- Blaye- Saint Emilion.-

Welcome to your Europamundo Trip Style!!!

The information about the meeting place and start time of your circuit can be found on your voucher.

After breakfast. Our first stop will be at the confluence of the Garonne and Dordogne rivers, and between vineyards we head to **PAUILLAC**, capital of the Médoc wine, time to stroll through its charming marina. We will continue to the **LAMARQUE** pier to cross the Garona river by boat. We will arrive at **BLAYE**, and we will enjoy our free time in this beautiful walled citadel, classified World Heritage by UNESCO. A 17th century military masterpiece, the Blaye Citadel has witnessed many historical and military events due to its strategic location.

We will continue to to **SAINT-EMILION**, declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO and we will visit the Clos des Menuts, where you will discover its beautiful monolithic cellars from the 12th century located in the heart of the medieval city. Accommodation.

## Day 02 . Saint Emilion – Aubeterre-sur-Dronne - Brantome – Perigueux – Les Eyzies de Tayac - Lascaux Caves – Sarlat.-

After Breakfast. We will start our day in the pretty village of **AUBETERRE-SUR-DRONNE**, where we will find an unusual landmark, the monolithic church of Saint-Jean, **the underground church of Saint-Jean**, that was carved in the rock in the 12th century by Benedictine monks. We will visit its interior (**entrance included**)

We will head toward **BRANTOME**, with romantic architecture, called the “green Venice” of Périgord. We will find remarkable places such as the Benedictine abbey, and we will have a walk in the streets of the old town.

Nearby is the city of **PERIGUEUX**, located at the pilgrims’ pass on the Camino de Santiago with an important historical heritage, majestic castles, vestiges of the medieval or Renaissance times, cathedral, abbeys and priories, witnesses of an intense spiritual life. We will see lands with the fields where such noble products as strawberries, truffles and mushrooms are coming from.

Time to walk through the capital of Perigord.

We continue visiting **LES EYZIES-DE-TAVAC-SIREUIL**, known for its high concentration of prehistoric caves to discover. The National Museum of Prehistory is located here. Time for a walk

We continue with rock art making with a visit of one of the most important caves, **Lascaux Caves (entrance included)**

We finish the day in the small medieval town of **SARLAT**, a world heritage site, preserving an incredibly well-preserved Renaissance historic center with its markets essential to taste their gastronomy: foie gras, mushrooms, confit, magret, truffles, nuts wines... Time to enjoy all of them and accommodation.

## Day 03 . Sarlat – Beynac-et-Cazenac - La Roque-Gageac - Domme - Turenne – Collonges la Rouge - Martel – Rocamadour.-

In the morning we will travel along the Dordogne River. Between cliffs, we will visit wonderful villages such as **BEYNAC-ET-CAZENAC**, where the **Castle of Beynac** is located (**entrance included**). Dating from the 12th century and one of the best-preserved medieval castles, it preserves its authenticity and offers amazing views of the valley and river.

Following the river path we will stop at **LA ROQUE-GAGEAC**, located down of a cliff where we will discover its narrow streets, its troglodytic fort, its tropical vegetation and its small church that dominates the valley.



A few kilometers from there we will meet **DOMME**, where we will make a brief stop to be able to contemplate from its viewpoint an exceptional panoramic view of the Dordogne valley.

We follow the river on our way to **TURENNE**, a small town that preserves many traces of its rich medieval past.

After a pleasant walk we will continue towards **COLLOGNES LA ROUGE**, a beautiful town located between walnut and chestnut trees and characteristic for the reddish color of its houses.

We continue our trip to **MARTEL**, a beautiful town known as “the city of the seven towers”, with a rich architectural heritage.

Our last stop will be in **ROCAMADOUR**, known as a sacred city and a prominent place of pilgrimage. Located on a massive cliff where its famous sanctuary of the Black Madonna stands out. Time to enjoy this wonderful citadel. Accommodation.

### Day 04 . Rocamadour – Saint-Cirq-Lapopie- Cahors – Lauzerte- Pujols – Bordeaux.-

We will cross the Natural Park of the Causses du Quercy Region and we will arrive in **SAINT-CIRQ-LAPOPIE**. The whole city is considered as a historic monument and it is on the list of “The most beautiful villages in France”.

We take advantage of our route through the province of Lot to see another city full of art and history, **CAHORS**. Its narrow streets and monuments are testimonies of its history, from Gallo-Roman times to medieval times. With our guide we will visit one of its famous **Cha-teau** surrounded by vineyards and we will be able to taste the wines of the region (**entrance included**).

We continue to **LAUZERTE**, hanging town and important point for pilgrims, a medieval town full of charm and magic.

Before ending this wonderful route through the south of France, we will make a stop at another unique medieval town, **PUJOLS**. Surrounded by vineyards, we will walk with our guide through its flowery alleys dotted by beautiful houses. Arrival in **BORDEAUX**.

## CASTLES IN EASTERN BELGIUM AND LUXEMBOURG

### Day 01 . Brussels- Alden Biesen- Fallais- Jehay-bodegne- Liege.-

**Welcome to your Europamundo Trip Style!!!**

The information about the meeting place and start time of your circuit can be found on your voucher.

Early departure from Brussels to **RIJKHOVEN**, a small village in the province of Limburg surrounded by apple, pear, and cherry fields where we will find the beautifully preserved **CASTLE OF ALDEN BIESEN**, a former property of the Teutonic Order. Legend has it among Belgian children that this is Santa Claus' residence when he arrives at the country to leave presents. Time to visit the site and stroll through the gardens.

We drive to the **Wallonia region** and our first stop will be at **FALLAIS CASTLE**, located in the small village of **Braives**. It is a XIII century fortress with moats and round corner towers. The tour continues through this land of castles to visit the

most emblematic castle in the province of Liège, **THE JENAY-BODEGNÉE CASTLE**. Located in a beautiful environment of wooded areas and wide meadows, it is a neo-Gothic style castle with a gridded facade and peculiar walls that look like a huge chessboard.

The journey continues to **LIEGE**, the cultural and economic capital of Wallonia. We will enjoy a city tour with our guide where we will visit the Calatrava Station, Tour Paradis, Parc de la Boverie, Mediacité, or the Cathedral Square. A break for lunch in the city centre and optionally visit St. Paul's Cathedral and its stunning treasure. We continue to explore this beautiful university city by visiting other places of great interest in the old town centre: Opera Square, Saint-Lambert Square, the Princes-Bishops' Palace, the Market Square, Saint-Antoine's Church, the Collegiate Church of Saint-Barthélemy, and Commissioner Maigret's Square. And, as could not be otherwise, time to taste some of the varied Belgian beers. Accommodation.

## Day 02 . Liège -Vianden-Luxembourg -Echternach-Beaufort- Luxembourg.-

Today we leave Belgium to discover **the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg**. First of all, a stop in the small town of **Vianden** where **the VIANDEN CASTLE** stands, the most impressive castle in Luxembourg, built on a rocky promontory. It was built on an old Roman fortress and was the residence of the Dukes of Vianden. It suffered a great fire and an earthquake which left it almost in absolute ruin for many years until 1977 when the State took it back and began an arduous task of reconstruction leaving the current great fortress (**entrance included**).

Arrival in the capital of the duchy, **LUXEMBOURG**, and together with our guide we visit the beautiful old town where discover the Constitution Square, the Cathedral, the Grand Ducal Palace, St. Michael's Church, the Balcony of Europe, the Wilhelm II Square, or Place d'Armes. After this beautiful visit, a time for lunch and recharge our batteries.

The route continues and, before reaching Echternach, we make a photo stop at **the World War II American Cemetery** in memory of its soldiers. Arrival in **ECHTERNACH**, the oldest town in Luxembourg, which has preserved its medieval atmosphere with its labyrinthine alleys in which we get lost with our guide.

Our route will take us to the Mellerdall Nature Park via the "Wolf Gorge" through beautiful landscapes of lush forests. We will get **BEAUFORT CASTLE**, located in the village of the





WALZIN

same name, impressive XI century architecture that was built on a small quadrangular fortress overlooking the Moselle valley. Visit the **castle and tasting of forest fruit liqueurs (entrance included)**. Return to Luxembourg for accommodation.

### Day 03 . Luxembourg -Lassus-Modave-Dinant.-

Return to **Belgium** and our first stop is at **LASSUS CASTLE**, located in a small village on the banks of the Ourthe River, a charming XIV century fortress that was restored in the XVIII century in the Louis XIV style.

Continue to a small village on the banks of the Hoyoux River, **MODAVE**, where we will visit the castle, **CHATEAU DE MODAVE**, a manor house located in a beautiful environment and famous for its interiors decorated with stuccoes, tapestries, great artworks and furniture with exceptional pieces from the XVII to the XIX century (**entrance fee included**).

We now drive towards **DINANT**, a beautiful city on the banks of the Meuse River and nestled in the rocky massif of Ardennes, a genuine postcard image which can be enjoyed by strolling through its streets and where to have lunch. Passing over the Charles de Gaulle Bridge we have

the best view of the city and from here we can contemplate the impressive Collegiate Church of Notre-Dame, the Citadel, and a whole row of houses that follow one after the other along the river. We take a **cable car ride** up to the top of the cliff to visit the **Citadel**, a World War I site that has been used for centuries as a watchtower (**entrance fees included**). Freÿr Castle, on the outskirts of Dinant, is a magnificent Renaissance-style residence with extensive maze-like gardens and beautiful views over the Meuse River. The interior has large frescoed foyers, classical halls, alcoves in a variety of styles, a Rococo chapel, and a valuable decorative earthenware collection. Those who wish to visit the castle are welcome to do so.

Return to **DINANT** to enjoy a panoramic **cruise down the Meuse River (entrance fee included)**. Accommodation.

#### Day 04 . Dinant- Walzin-Vêves-Lavaux Sainte Anne-Chimay-Beersel-Brussels--

After breakfast, early departure from Dinant early towards the village of **Walzin**, in the province of Namur, where we take a short walk along the banks of the Lesse River, crossing the footbridge to admire the **WALZIN CASTLE**, perched on a rock over a meander of the river in a legendary setting.

Nearby we enjoy another of the most beautiful castles in the country, **VÈVES CASTLE**, a XV century fortress with the appearance of a fairy-tale castle, flanked by six round towers of different sizes.

Our day continues in search of the next dream castle, entering the natural Famenne region to find the **CASTLE LAVOUX-SAINTE-ANNE** in the surroundings of the town of Rochefort. We visit this medieval fortress built in the XV century with Renaissance influences and surrounded by a deep-water moat (**entrance included**).

We enter the province of Hainaut to reach **CHIMAY**, a small French-speaking Belgian village well known both for its beer and its local cheese. There is time to stroll through its streets, have lunch and taste its famous products and, should you wish, you are able to visit **the CHIMAY CASTLE**, with its rococo theatre renowned as an exceptional heritage of the Walonia region (optional entrance).

Departure to the Brabant region where we stop and photograph **the BEERSEL CASTLE**, an authentic medieval fortified castle in a perfect state of preservation, made of red brick and surrounded by a moat-like pond.

Return to **BRUSSELS**, leaving behind the legendary landscapes and castles that will remain with us forever. End of services.



### Day 01 . Brussels- Tervuren- Lovaina- Malinas- Cleydael- Sterckshof- Antwerp.-

**Welcome to your Europamundo Trip Style!!!**

The information about the meeting place and start time of your circuit can be found on your voucher.

We will take off from Brussels and travel to **TERVUREN PARK** where we will find charming lake trails and **Tervuren Palace**, built by King Leopold II as his small Versailles, which today houses the Museum of Africa.

After, we will head to **LEUVEN** the Flemish Brabant capital and seat of the oldest university in the Netherlands. We will go on a **guided tour** of the town, first stopping at the Renaissance palace of Arenberg, then the city centre whose historical heritage includes the biggest Beguinage in Belgium, the historic university colleges, the Old Square (centre of college life), the Main Square with an impressive gothic Town Hall and the magisterial church of St Peter to name some.

Next, we will get to know **MECHELEN**, a town with a rich history, with monuments and landmarks that bear witness to that, such as the cathedral, the three buildings



of the Town Hall, the numerous churches, the Main Square and the Palace of Margaret of Austria – this was the residence of the princess that could have been queen of Castile and Aragon, considered to have introduced the Renaissance into the Netherlands. Time to have lunch.

In the afternoon, we will travel to **CLEYDAEL CASTLE** a classical 16th century brick structure. Then, we will go to **STERCKSHOF CASTLE**, an old 16th century, red brick manor residence, with striking turrets, a moat and French gardens built on the banks of the River Schjijn.

We will wrap up our day's activities in **ANTWERP** the economic and cultural capital of the Flemish region. We will stroll through the historical town centre, starting at the incredible railway station, then the Diamond Quarter, Meir Avenue, Groen Square, Cathedral, Main Square, Town Hall and Meat House, finishing our visit at Steen, the small medieval fortress on the banks of the Scheldt river that boast of breath-taking views. Accommodation. Free time to keep exploring the city if we feel like it.

### Day 02 . Antwerp - Laarne - Ghent - Poeke - Bruges.-

Today, we will travel to the Province of East-Flanders and stop at **Laarne Castle** a moated situated on a bend of the river Scheldt. The structure combines the look of a medieval fortress with that of a stately 17th century residence. We will travel next to **GHENT**, capital of the area, one of the richest monumental cities in Belgium and emperor Charles V's birthplace. Our guide will accompany us through the historical city centre, where we will be able to admire constructions such as the Cathedral of St Bavo, the Town Hall, the Civil Bell Tower, the churches of Saints Michael and Nicholas, the Dock of Herbs and the **Counts Castle (entrance included)**. Counts Castle is the only well-preserved medieval castle remaining in Flanders. It hosts an impressive collection of weaponry and armours, as well as torture contraptions. Later, we will be heading to **POEKE CASTLE** where there is an extensive park and pond. The structure was built in the 18th century over the ruins of a medieval palace.

Next, we will travel to **BRUGES**, dubbed the "Venice of the North", one of the most beautiful medieval towns in Europe and UNESCO World Heritage Site. Together with our guide we will explore this bewitching city, monuments and landmarks, such as - Minnewater (or the "Lake of Love"), the Beguinage, the Hospital of St John, the church of Our Lady, Rosary Dock, Burg Square and Main Square with the Bell Tower and palaces. Time to have lunch. After, we will visit **LOPPEM CASTLE (entrance included)**, a majestic Neo-Gothic structure surrounded by a beautiful park with ponds, grottoes and a maze. Inside, we can still see the original decoration and furniture, and an impressive art collection. Free time to have dinner and to enjoy the city at dusk. Accommodation in Bruges.

### Day 03 . Bruges - Tillegem - Veurne -Beauvoorde - Dixmude - Rumbek - Ypres - Cortrique.-

Today, an intense day waits us! We will be touring the province of Eastern Flanders, our first stop **Tilligem Castle**, a beautiful Neo-Gothic reconstruction of an old medieval 13th



century castle. Our next stop will be the small town of **VEURNE** a true hidden gem. The Market Square, a large square shaped space, is one of the most beautiful main plazas in the country. A short distance away, we will find **Beauvoorde Castle**, an old medieval fortress rebuilt in a Renaissance style in the 17th century. We will then travel through the Westhoek region, in a polder zone. **DIXMUDA** is a Flemish city on the banks of Yser river. Here, we will explore its Main Square, outstanding Town Hall, the Gothic style St Nicholas Church and the 13th century Beguinage.

After lunch, we will stop at the Renaissance **Rumbek Castle** with characteristic cone-roof towers and beautiful grounds, ponds and forest. A few miles out, we will reach the biggest city in Eastern Flanders, **YPRES**. This historically relevant town was also the scene of the first chemical-weapon attack during First World War. Here, we will visit the Main Square and get to see the Gothic cathedral of St. Martin and the Cloth Market, a stone-building from 13th century, which served as a symbol of the power and wealth of the city.



We will finish our day in **CORTRIQUE**, a town with a troubled history, rich in cultural and religious heritage with an outstanding Main Square and Gothic Town Hall, a Beguinage, the Chapel of the Counts and several other religious buildings. Accommodation in Cortrique.

#### Day 04 . Cortrique - Lille - Tournai - Beloeil - Viron - Brussels.-

We will cross the French border and get to know the Old County of Flanders which was incorporated into France in the 17<sup>th</sup> century. Here, we will visit **LILLE**, old capital of "Gallic Flanders", with a beautiful historical town centre, the Vieux-Lille or Old Quarter. We will walk on the cobbled streets, surrounded by typical-Flemish architecture as well as see the Grand-Place, the Old Stock Exchange, the Opera Theatre, the Chamber of Commerce, the church of St Mauritius and the military citadel.

We will return to Belgium to explore **TOURNAI**, one of Belgium's oldest cities which was culturally and religiously important during the Middle Ages. Some of the highlights are the old centre, the Main Square, the Romanesque-Gothic cathedral and the municipal Bel Tower or "Beffroi", the oldest in Belgium. Time to have some lunch at one of the many restaurants. The next stop in our trip is **BELOEIL**. We will visit its castle considered the "Belgian Versailles", which sits surrounded by beautiful baroque gardens and a water mirror pond upon which the castle reflects.

After a stop at the romantic Neo-Tudor **Viron Castle** we will travel back to Brussels, late-afternoon arrival. **Arrival and end of services.** Our guide will drop you off at the agreed point. **We hope you have enjoyed your trip with Europamundo.**



# FRANCE: TRAVELLING THROUGH THE MEMORY OF THE GREAT WARS

### Day 01 . Paris- Landings Beaches- Caen.-

**Welcome to your Europamundo Trip Style!!!**

The information about the meeting place and start time of your circuit can be found on your voucher.

Today, during our tour, we will have the opportunity to visit some of the main beaches of the **Normandy landings** which were the beginning of a long and hard campaign to liberate Northwest Europe from Nazi occupation.

We will leave Paris early in the morning; our first stop will be at **Omaha Beach** where we will visit the Monument to the Brave, the Memorial Museum and the American Cemetery. From here, we will continue to **Arromanches**, another of the decisive sites where the British and American troops arrived which, currently, is a very popular seaside destination. We will have time for lunch in this village. The next beach we will get to know will be **Juno Beach**. The Canadians took this location to later join the British offensive. We will visit the Juno Beach Centre.



In the middle of the afternoon, we will arrive at **CAEN**. Despite the bombings suffered in June 1944, the historical-artistic city preserves a great architectural heritage that we can still enjoy. And, of course, we will visit **the Caen Memorial Museum**, a museum dedicated to peace that recreates history from 1918 to the present day (**entrance fee included**).

Accommodation.

## Day 02 . Caen-Rouen-Calais-Éperleques- Dunkirk .-

Early in the morning we head to **ROUEN**, a city that, although it was also seriously damaged in World War II, is a true museum city known as “the city of hundred bell towers”. We will have time to visit its Gothic Cathedral and stroll through its medieval streets.

We will continue our journey to **CALAIS**, the gateway to the English Channel. Another area that felt the devastation of World War II and suffered numerous damages. Accompanied with our guide we will visit the Guet Tower (Tour du Guet), Notre-Dame Church and the Monument of “The Burghers of Calais”, one of Rodin’s main works. We will take the opportunity to have lunch in this village.

Not far from there we will find **ÉPERLEQUES**, located in the forest of this town we will visit an immense bunker from which the Germans launched missiles towards England during the Nazi era (**entrance fee included**).

Next, we will go to **DUNKIRK** which is the third port of France and a city hard hit by countless wars. During World War II here, on its beaches, took place the so-called “miracle of Dunkirk”, the most famous withdraw of the allies, which became known as “Operation Dynamo”. We will be able to enjoy the centre of this city and contemplate two towers declared a World Heritage Site, the one of Saint Eloi Church and the other one the Town Hall. Accommodation.

## Day 03 . Dunkirk-Ring of Memory -Vimy Memorial -Lens-Amiens. --

We will continue our journey south to reach **the Ring of Memory**, a living museum located on the hill of Notre-Dame de Lorette where the names of the 580,000 who died during World War I are listed to honour them.

A few kilometres from this museum is **the Vimy Memorial**, an impressive monument built by Canadians to commemorate their 66 000 casualties during the war. We will visit it and we will also see part of the reconstructed trenches and tunnels.

After that, we will arrive at the centre of **LENS**, a city very affected by the two World Wars and, later, by the decline of mining which was its main economic activity. Fortunately, it has



managed to rebuild itself. An example of that is it’s **Louvre-Lens Museum** built on an old coal mine (**entrance free included**).

After lunch we will continue to **NAOURS**, an authentic underground city of Roman origin built in the III century and which was used during the two World Wars, becoming Nazis headquarters (**entrance fee included**).

Our last stop will be in the charming town of **AMIENS**. Accommodation

## Day 04 . Amiens-Château de Péronne - Saint Quentin -Paris.-

In the morning we will have the opportunity to walk through the streets of this city as full of life and charm, its Notre-Damme Cathedral stands out. declared World Heritage Site. The building was the scene of the “Battle of Amiens”, one of the important allied offensives on the Western Front during World War I.

Day 01 . Toulouse- Najac- Cordes- Albi- Lastours- Carcassonne-

Welcome to your Europamundo Trip Style!!!

The information about the meeting place and start time of your circuit can be found on your voucher.

We start our trip in Toulouse and from there we will go to **NAJAC**. One of the most beautiful villages in France sitting on a rocky promontory and surrounded by forests. First medieval town on our route and the first castle we will visit.

A few kilometers from Najac towards Albi, we will take the opportunity to visit another impressive place in our route, **CORDES-SUR-CIEL** where we will stop to enjoy its 14th century Gothic houses and its narrow streets, very well preserved and full of artisan or artist workshops.

After these two extraordinary visits, we will arrive in **ALBI** for lunch we will stroll through the streets around the market and the Cathedral of Ste. Cecile, an authentic brick fortress from the outside, but a Gothic jewel inside.

Before arriving in the evening in Carcassonne, we will make a stop at the **Belvédère de Montfermier** viewpoint to observe one of the greatest icons of the vestiges of the glorious Cathar past in the area; we refer to the **4 towers of LASTOURS** that rise above the top of a rocky plinth.

Arrival in the fabulous walled city of **CARCASSONNE**. Check in at the hotel.

## Day 02 . Carcassonne – Minerve – Narbonne.-

We will start the day with a visit to the city of **Carcassonne** with our tour guide, a medieval complex that has been perfectly restored; We will visit the interior of Château Comtal, which is a fortress within a fortress with five towers, a moat and defensive wooden galleries on the walls where we will take a walk through. Next, we will stroll through the walled city where it is also worth visiting the Basilica of St. Nazaire, where the famous stone of the Site stands out, named after the fence of Carcassonne in 1209 by the Crusades.

After lunch, we will go to **MINERVE**, one of the main refuges for Cathars during the Albigensian Crusade. The village has been recognized as one of the most beautiful villages in France, Les plus beaux villages de France. The city keeps many vestiges of the medieval era: the medieval wall, the fortified gates, its fillets, its towers and the vestiges of the castle that defended the citadel in its narrowest part. Today only the 13th century north wall remains.

Departure to **NARBONNE** and walk through the center with our tour leader. Narbonne was the capital of the ancient Roman province of Narbonensis. Its fortified cathedral began construction in the 13th century but has not been completed yet. The city has numerous elegant squares and public buildings. Although it was not a Cathar City, it is a unique place to meet, dine and rest.

## Day 03 . Narbonne – Fontfroid – Lagrasse – Castle of Peyrepertuse – Limoux.-

Today we will visit valleys and mountains with hills of pine trees and vineyards. We start in the morning with a visit to the **Benedictine Abbey of Fontfroide (entrance included)**, which is the most spectacular of the almost ten that we can find in the region. This Cistercian monument was the precursor of other religious buildings such as the Royal Monastery of Poblet. It has a spectacular rose garden of 2,500 flowers and a very important story on our route: the murder of a monk from Fontfroide, at the beginning of the 13th century, was the trigger for the crusade against the Cathars.

After our visit we continue to **LAGRASSE** (another place known for its abbey) where one of the most charming towns in France is waiting for us. Famous because of its fairs, it was a meeting place for merchants and artists. The streets and shops of the town were trapped by the heritage of its extraordinary past. There, we will find all kinds of local products. Free time to taste Occitan cuisine.

Leaving behind the fabulous town of Lagrasse and its Pont Vieux, we will go to the Pyrenees-Orientales, the most important area in Cathar Castles. On our way we will see the impressive fortresses of Villeneuve-Termenès and Padern to culminate in the stop of the vertigo citadel of the **Peyrepertuse Castle (entrance included)** where we will visit the interior to check the importance of the strategic enclave of a key place in the border control between the kingdoms of France and Aragon.



ALBI

After a legendary day, we will arrive at the city of **LIMOUX**, which has a great Cathar legacy and today is very famous for its carnival that they celebrate for three months. Optionally, we can visit one of the wineries where the famous Blanquette de Limoux is produced, which we will taste. Dinner and rest.

## Day 04 . Limoux - Puivert Castle - Camon - Mirepoix - Montségur Castle - Foix - Toulouse.-

After breakfast, we travel to **Puivert Castle (entrance included)**. At the top of the hill, this old local Cathar, conquest by the crusaders in 1210 dominates the city of Puivert and its lake.

We will arrive at the fortified medieval village of **CAMON** known as the little Carcassonne, it is considered one of the most beautiful villages in France. The door of the Clock, the high house, the walls, the abbey-castle or the church from the XVI century and its treasure are some of the attractions that we will discover.

Around midday we arrive at **MIREPOIX**, which preserves its medieval appearance from the end of the 13th century when it was rebuilt. We will walk with our tour guide through this town where we will have lunch.



**Day 01 . Paris- Lyons-la-foret- Rouen- Le Bec-hellouin- Honfleur- Beuvron-en-auge- Lisieux-**

We start today by visiting **VEZELAY**, a bastion of Christianity since the Middle Ages and a meeting point during the pilgrimage to San Santiago de Compostela. We will visit the **Basilica of Saint-Madeleine (entrance included)**, which was classified as a World Heritage Site by the UNESCO.

We continue our route to **NOYERS SUR SEREIN**, a small town that preserves its medieval past in its old narrow streets, picturesque squares, fortified gates and walls flanked by towers. Time to have a walk.

Next stop is among some wonderful landscapes: we will visit the **Fontenay Abbey (entrance included)**, the oldest of the Cistercian foundations that remain in France, splendidly well preserved, is part of the UNESCO World Heritage.

## Day 05 . Nevers - Bourgues -Orleans - Yevre le Châtel - Moret sur Loing- Paris.-

We leave early to visit the town of **BOURGUES**. ### Day 01 . Brussels- Durbuy- Rochefort- Dinant- Orval- Bouillon- Welcome to your Europamundo Trip Style!!!

The information about the meeting place and start time of your circuit can be found on your voucher.

We will leave Brussels early in the direction of **DURBUY**, a small medieval town surrounded by forests on the banks of the Ourthe River, known as “the smallest city in the world”. It has a castle surrounded by narrow alleys full of charm and a curious park. We will walk through its cobbled streets and along the wooded path that surrounds the town.

Next, we will stop at **the Abbey of Our Lady of Saint Remy of ROCHEFORT**, located in a beautiful environment. This beautiful town has a small **museum dedicated to Trappist Beers** where we will find the beers made in the abbey (**entrance included**). Rochefort also stands out for its Neo-Romanesque style Our Lady of the Visitation College Church and for the Counts Castle Ruins.

We continue to **DINANT**, a beautiful city on the banks of the Meuse River and nestled between the rocky massif of the Ardennes, a true postcard city. We shall cross the Charles de Gaulle Bridge in order to appreciate the urban landscape, where we will be able to spot the Citadel and the impressive Collegiate Church of Our Lady.. We will have time to stroll around and after a good lunch we will take a **panoramic river cruise (entrance included)**.

We will enter the small region of Gaume to visit **the Abbey Our Lady of Orval**, one of the most beautiful in Europe and located in a natural reserve. A place where they elaborated not only their own trappist beer, but also their famous cheese. In its premises it has a monastic museum, "Communs Abraham", a garden of medicinal plants, Countess Matilde famous fountain, a pharmaceutical museum and the ruins of the old Abbey (**entrance included**). We will have the opportunity to taste their beers and cheeses in the gastronomic space "A l' Ange Gardien". We can also stroll around the beautiful natural landscapes that surround it.

Accommodation in the **BOUILLON** area.

### Day 02 . Bouillon-Chimay-Tournai-Ghent.-

We enter the green region of the Ardennes. Our first stop will be at **the Abbey of Our Lady of Scourmont of Chimay**, a Trappist Monastery located on a plateau where hundreds of years ago the monks began to make beer and cheese in order to help the region. We can learn about its history and curiosities in the Interactive Space with an **exclusive tasting** of Chimay Dorée (**entrance included**).

We will then head to **TOURNAI**, one of the oldest cities in Belgium, an important economic, cultural, and religious centre during the Middle Ages and the Renaissance. Together with our guide, we will walk through its historic centre and contemplate the Main Square, the Cathedral with its Belfroi, the oldest bell tower in Belgium.

We will now move to the province of East Flanders where the beautiful **GHENT** stands out. Sentimental capital of Flanders and birthplace of Emperor Charles V, one of the cities with the greatest monumental heritage in the country, a true Flemish jewel. We will take a photographic walking tour of its historic centre, visiting Saint Bavo 's Cathedral, which houses one of the most admired paintings in the world on its altar: "The Adoration of the Mystical Lamb". We will walk through its Town Hall, the Civil Bell Tower, the Churches of Saint Michael and Saint Nicholas, the Herbs Pier or the Counts ' Castle. We will have dinner for its lively centre and accommodation.

### Day 03 . Ghent-Westvleteren-Bruges.-

We will pass through the province of West Flanders and among landscapes that were the site of World War I to arrive at **the Abbey of Saint Sixtus of Westvleteren**, the only place in the

world to taste what is considered by experts and many fans as the best beer in the world, the “Westvleteren 12” (**admission included**).

Let ‘s continue our tour towards one of the best-preserved medieval cities in the world: **BRUGES**. A quiet and welcoming city of beauty suspended in time, surrounded by its wall and full of canals that will make us travel to the Middle Ages. Time to walk through its centre and discover its corners and monuments: the Minnewater or “Lake of Love”, the Béguinage, St. John ‘s Hospital, Our Lady ‘s Church, the Rosary Quay or the unforgettable Main Square with its bell tower and its palaces. Accommodation.

#### Day 04 . Bruges-Antwerp-Westmalle-Achel-Brussels.-

We continue to immerse ourselves in the world of Trappist Beer and for this we will visit **the Trappist Abbey of Westmalle**, located in a beautiful environment where you can breathe the tranquility of the monks who live there (**entrance included**). We can taste the beers elaborated in the abbey and their delicious cheeses in their “Trappisten” café.

We will now head towards the “city of diamonds”, **ANTWERP**. A city of contrasts where we will find medieval buildings such as its Town Hall or the houses in the Great Market Square up to

the contemporary Palace of Justice and all its Art Nouveau jewels, an authentic city with style.

Before ending our Flemish tour, we will stop at **the Abbey of St Benedict of Achel** where we will find the store with the largest variety of beer on the entire tour (**entrance included**). As in the previous Trappist abbeys we can observe the quiet life of its monks, where prayer, reading and the manual elaboration of their products mark their lifestyle.

We will return to **BRUSSELS** being almost experts in the history of Trappist beer, since, as the monastics say "a beer made with knowledge is drunk with wisdom".

### Day 01 . Nice.-

**Welcome to your Europamundo Trip Style!!!**

The information about the meeting place and start time of your circuit can be found on your voucher.

"Why Nice? For this necessary cleanness." Matisse answered this at the place where he spent half of his life attracted by its unique atmosphere. Our trip starts here, in the most Italian of the French cities, cradle of tourism and true starting point to tour the region of light.

We will first head north of the city in our vehicle, to the district of Cimiez. We will visit there the Arènes archaeological area, the ancient Amphitheatre and the Roman baths, and the Villa des Arènes stands above them, sumptuous historical building that is home to the **Matisse Museum (entrance included)**. The painter settled in Nice in 1917 and resided there until his death in 1954. We will know the artist in depth through an extensive collection of more than thirty canvases and four hundred drawings and engravings, but also the most intimate Matisse, thanks to a huge number of objects that belonged to his workshop. The ancient

Hotel Régina is nearby, now converted into luxurious apartments, built to accommodate Queen Victoria of England according to her comfort demands in the late XIX century. After the visit, our guide will walk with you to the nearby **Cemetery of Cimiez** where Matisse's tomb is located.

Afterwards, we head to the city center where our guide will suggest us to try the nizzarda cuisine in one of its many restaurants. In the afternoon, we will visit the **Marc Chagall National Museum in Nice (entrance included)**. The Belarusian artist arrived in France in 1950 and spent the last years of his life residing in Vence, a few kilometers from Nice, where he worked on the project "Biblical Message", a series of large canvases that today are in this museum, which also has a complete collection since his beginning.

We will continue to know the attractions of the city: Promenade des Anglais seafront, meeting place for locals and foreigners and symbol of the hatching of tourism in the XIX century, Massena Square, old Nice, the port area and Garibaldi Square. Accommodation.

## Day 02 . Nice-Saint Paul of Vence-Cagnes sur mer- Antibes-Cannes.-

We leave Nice, but not the Cote d'Azur and the sea that gives it its name. First of all, we will visit the small town of **SAINT PAUL OF VENCE**. Painters such as Signac, Dufy, Matisse, Picasso, Braque or Modigliani frequented this typical southern French village. A regular meeting point was the hostel run by art lover Paul Roux: "La Colombe d'Or", where artists often paid with their works, making it today an emblematic hotel-restaurant, which walls are an authentic museum. Together with our guide we will walk through the alleys of the village and we can visit the tomb of Marc Chagall in the local cemetery. From there, we will go in our vehicle to know the nearby **Chapel of the Rosary of Vence (entrance included)**. In this humble Dominican Sisters convent was Sister Jacques Marie (Monique Bourgeois), who had been Matisse's nurse and assistant in the 1940s, and who asked the painter for advice to decorate the interior and stained-glass windows of the chapel. Matisse, in very adverse health conditions, turned for four years on his latest major project, which he considered his masterpiece.

After this exciting visit, we will head to the sanctuary of one of impressionism's fathers, the **Renoir Museum in CAGNES SUR MER (entrance included)**. In search of mild winters, Renoir settled in this town in 1903 as an artist already consecrated. In 1907 he acquired the villa Domaine des Colletes, where he lived until his death in 1919. This villa-museum is the best way to immerse yourself in Renoir's creative universe thanks to its collection, but also to the intimate spaces: the workshop, the kitchen, the bathroom and the beautiful garden in which he so often installed his easel.

## THE PAINTERS' ROUTE THROUGH THE SOUTH OF FRANCE

Next, we will head to the nearby town of **ANTIBES**, a lively seaside place where we will have time to stroll and have lunch.

Afterwards, we will visit the **Picasso Museum of Antibes - Juan-Les-Pins (entrance included)**. The museum is housed in a castle that belonged to the Grimaldi family from the XIV century until the French Revolution. Picasso first arrived to this castle in 1945 and admired for its terraces overlooking the sea, he did not hesitate to accept the museum's offer to set up a workshop in the castle. "Here I'm not just going to paint for myself. I'm going to decorate the museum," he said then. Picasso left 23 paintings and 44 drawings. Thanks to subsequent donations, the museum preserves many other works by the author, especially ceramics, as well as other prominent figures of XX-century art.

After the visit, we will head to **CANNES**, where we can tour the historic center and the promenade, home to the Cotê d'Azur glamour and meeting point of the film stars that go at one of the most important film festivals in the world. Accommodation.

### Day 03 . Cannes-Vallauris-Saint Juan les Pins-Saint Tropez-MARSEILLE.-

We will leave Cannes to delve into the Spanish genius' work: **the Picasso War and Peace National Museum (entrance included)**, installed in **VALLAURIS**, a ceramicist tradition village. Picasso made two large more than 10 meters long canvases representing war and peace, completed in 1952 and installed in a Romanesque chapel that today is home to this National Museum. Later, the artist painted at the bottom of the chapel "The Four Parts of the World" a fresco painting.

Then we will set off for one of the most renowned towns on the Cotê d'Azur: **SAINT TROPEZ**. Ancient fishing village that has not lost its charm over time. We will stroll through the streets of this jewel nestled between the citadel and the port where we will have time for lunch.

In the afternoon, we head to **MARSEILLE**, capital of the Provence-Alps-Cote d'Azur region, second city and largest port in the country. Our guide will help you get to know the Vieux Port, Avenue de la Canebière and the vibrant historic center of the oldest city in France. Accommodation.

### Day 04 . Marseille - Aix-en-Provence - Arles.-

After breakfast, we will board with our vehicle to the Basilica of Notre Dame de la Garde (free entrance), affectionately called the Bonne Mère (Good Mother) by the Marseillais. After visiting the interior of the church, from which hang models of boats that appreciate her protection, we will get a fabulous view of the city and the port.

Later, we will head to the nearby **AIX-EN-PROVENCE**, and we will do it through a very special road: the Cézanne road. Paul Cézanne was born, died and spent long periods of his life in Aix,

and he was always linked to Provence. Here we will visit **Cézanne's Workshop (entrance included)**, where he worked every morning for the last four years of his life. Entering his studio, home of the light and objects that starred in his still lifes, is a sublime experience for lovers of his work. Afterwards, our guide will accompany you to the **Terrain des Peintres** (free entrance), a garden from which you can admire the majestic Sainte Victoire mountain, where nine reproductions of the author's series will give us an idea of his obsession with the search for the nuances of light and color. Then, we will enjoy time for lunch in the beautiful city of Aix-en-Provence.

In the afternoon, we will head to **ARLES**. Our guide will accompany you on a walk through this beautiful city on the banks of the Rhone River. For us, especially evocative for the presence of one of the most fascinating figures in art history: Vincent van Gogh. The Dutchman lived in this area between 1888 and 1890, less than fifteen months in which he painted about 200 canvases, 100 drawings and watercolors and wrote more than 200 letters, immersed in a frantic creative activity. It is in Arles that his painting acquires the culminating maturity and innovation. Here he met Gauguin, with which he worked for two months in a period of mutual inspiration that ended in the well-known crisis that led him to cut off his left ear. With our guide you will have the chance to know the Hotel Dieu, today **Van Gogh Space (free admission)**. At Van Gogh time, it was the hospital where the artist healed from his wound, and where he returned on multiple occasions during the following months, laying with hallucinations. Here he painted some of his masterpieces. During the walk, you will have the opportunity to tour the Arles that Van Gogh knew, such as Alyscamps necropolis with Roman sarcophagus, which he painted in autumn, or the Café La Nuit, today called Café Van Gogh, in the Place du Forum, in addition to the many attractions of the ancient Arelatum, such as the thermal baths, the Theater or the Roman Amphitheatre, where bull-fights are held today. Accommodation.

### Day 05 . Arles-Les Baux de Provence-Saint Rémy-Avignon-Nice.-

We'll leave Arles early in the morning. A few minutes away we will make a photo stop at Montmajour Abbey, nestled in the Provencal countryside and drawn by Van Gogh on multiple occasions. Next, we come up with a town of overwhelming beauty: **LES BAUX DE PROVENCE**. Nestled on the Massif des Alpilles mountains, Les Baux is one of the most impressive medieval ensembles in Provence, with narrow alleyways and topped by a castle that sits on a special kind of rock discovered in the XIX century and named Bauxite in honor of the town.

After an unforgettable walk, we will continue our route towards **SAINT REMY DE PROVENCE**. Next to the Roman site of Glanum is located the **Sanatorium of Saint Paul de Mausole (entrance included)**, a Romanesque monastery converted into a psychiatric hospital reached by a tormented Van Gogh due to outbursts of despair in May 1889, one of the most prolific years of his life. In this place, his room was rebuilt, which he also painted,



and reproductions of his works in the garden where they were conceived. Nowadays, the institution also has a psychiatric recovery center through painting.

Afterwards, we will move to Saint Rémy downtown, Nostradamus hometown, to soak up the Occitan culture in a short walk with our guide.

Later, we will arrive in the city of **AVIGNON**, an impressive monumental town on Rhone River left banks, the Popes' city and the theater capital. Here you can enjoy lunch on one of its terraces before you get to know the World Heritage Site.

In the afternoon, we will return to **NICE** and end this impressive journey. End of our services. Our guide will take you to the airport for your return flight or take you to the point of your choice if you are continuing your holiday.



### Day 01 . Paris- Blois- Tours- Villandry- Amboise.-

Welcome to your Europamundo Trip Style!!!

The information about the meeting place and start time of your circuit can be found on your voucher.

We will start the day by going to the south of France, to the area of the Loire Valley with a stop at **BLOIS**, a picturesque city where we recommend visiting the castle. After this we continue to the Loire Valley, visiting **TOURS**, the regional capital on the banks of the Loire River, where you will be able to take a stroll and have lunch. Then we will journey on to **AMBOISE**, a city with a fascinating medieval quarter.

### Day 02 . Amboise- Chenonceau- Chambord- Argenton- Limoges.-

A day to learn more about the Loire region. First a stroll through **Amboise** in the early hours to the Clos Lucé mansion where Leonardo da Vinci spent the last 3 years of his life. Exploring the Loire region in a little more depth, we visit **CHENONCEAU CASTLE (entrance included)**, built like a bridge over the River Cher. We continue to **CHAMBORD**, the largest castle of Loire (**entrance to the park included**). We will then travel to the centre of France, making a stop for coffee in **ARGEN-**

**TON SUR CREUSE**, a small medieval town on the banks of the Creuse River. We continue to **LIMOGES**, a city known for its porcelain, where we recommend a stroll in the centre to see its cathedral.

### Day 03 . Limoges- Lascaux- Sarlat- Beynac- Rocamadour.-

We will leave Limoges for the Dordogne. Few regions contain so many villages full of charm and unforgettable scenery. We arrive at **LASCAUX**, where we include admission to the museum and replica of the caves, here we will learn about the site's prehistory with the magnificent cave paintings. After that we see **SARLAT**, a world heritage town with an incredibly well-preserved Renaissance historic centre, where there will be time to stroll and have lunch. In **BEYNAC** we see a **medieval castle** overlooking the river (**admission included**). **ROCAMADOUR**, a beautiful medieval village with an important sanctuary "hung" over a ravine; we suggest you walk down the Via Crucis and come back up with the lift. **Dinner included.**

### Day 04 . Rocamadour- Padirac- Collonges la Rouge- St. Emilion- Bordeaux.-

We will go to the impressive **PADIRAC** caves, where we include a **boat ride on the river, 75 metres underground**. A stop at **COLLONGE LA ROUGE**, a very picturesque village built with red stone on the Way of St James. Time for lunch. After lunch we travel to **ST. EMILION**, at the heart of the Bordeaux wine producing region. Time for a stroll. **BORDEAUX**, arrival at the end of the afternoon.

*NB: The caves may be closed in the winter season, from November on, or due to weather conditions.*

### Day 05 . Bordeaux- Villandry- Paris.-

The entire centre of **Bordeaux** has been declared a World Heritage site. You will be amazed by the "water mirror" and will get to stroll through the old town with its pedestrian streets and 11th century cathedral. We **include admission** (free visit with audio-guide in English or French) to the **CITE DU VIN**, an impressive interactive museum that retells the history of wine and its production; wine tasting included at the viewpoint over Bordeaux. In the afternoon we will visit the **CHATEAU DE VILLANDRY**, famous for its gardens and flowers (entrance to the gardens included). Later, will have free time to stroll. We will continue our journey to **PARIS**. Arrival at the end of the day.



### Day 01 . Paris- Blois- Tours- Villandry- Amboise.-

Welcome to your Europamundo Trip Style!!!

The information about the meeting place and start time of your circuit can be found on your voucher.

We will start the day by going to the south of France, to the area of the Loire Valley with a stop at **BLOIS**, a picturesque city where we recommend visiting the castle. After this we continue to the Loire Valley, visiting **TOURS**, the regional capital on the banks of the Loire River, where you will be able to take a stroll and have lunch. Then we will journey on to **AMBOISE**, a city with a fascinating medieval quarter.

### Day 02 . Amboise- Bordeaux- Lourdes.-

We will continue on our way to the south of France, crossing lands full of vineyards. **BORDEAUX**, here we will have time to have lunch and a stroll through the city, whose centre was declared a World Heritage Site. We suggest you visit the Port of the Moon and St Andrew's Cathedral. We will then continue towards the Pyrenees. **LOURDES**, arrival in the late afternoon. You can attend the candle procession (which takes place until the end of October) and visit the places of worship. We **include dinner** at the hotel for all our passengers.

### Day 03 . Lourdes- Saint Bertrand- Carcassonne- Arles- Marseilles.-

Following parallel to the Pyrenees, we stop at **SAINT BERTRAND DE COMINGES**, a medieval village hanging on the mountain, dominated by its great cathedral. A time to walk before following **CARCASSON** city surrounded by the most beautiful walls of Europe. We continue to **ARLES**, the beautiful Provencal city that inspired Van Gogh which was formerly the provincial capital of Ancient Rome. The Amphitheatre, a World Heritage Site, is a witness to history.

We will continue to **MARSEILLES**, the second largest city in France, where you will get to explore the vibrant "Vieux Port". (Old port)

### Day 04 . Marseilles- Les Beaux- Avignon- La Garde D'Adhemar- Lyon.-

Villages, landscapes, history, today we will visit some of the most beautiful spots in Provence.

In **LES BEAUX**, we will have the opportunity to get to know this small medieval village, we will include the entrance to **CARRIERES DE LUMIERE** an impressive audio-visual art show held at an old quarry. We will have some time for a walk in **AVIGNON**, with its immense palace of the Popes. In **LA GARDE D'ADHEMAR** we will get to experience a typical town of Provence with its stone houses and typical streets next to the medieval church.

We continue towards **LYON**, where we can walk through the old neighbourhood declared a World Heritage Site. **We include the funicular ride up to Notre Dame de Fourviere** an immense basilica from where there is a great view over the city.

### Day 05 . Lyon- Tournus- La Rochepot- Beaune- Dijon.-

We will leave Lyon for Burgundy. Stopping at **TOURNUS**, a nice little town with a huge stone door and large abbey. After, we travel on small roads through beautiful vineyards and fields until **LA ROCHEPOT**, we include admission to its mighty medieval castle. **BEAUNE**, time for lunch and for a stroll in the wine capital of Burgundy; you can visit the wine museum or see the historic hospice. In the early afternoon, arrival in **DIJON**, the capital of Burgundy, with its lively streets, magnificent urban complex and many medieval and Renaissance buildings, particularly the Ducal Palace.



### Day 06 . Dijon- Fontenay Abbey- Semur en Auxois- Vezelay- Paris.-

We leave Dijon for **FONTENAY ABBEY**, a world heritage site, where we include admission to this Cistercian centre. After this, a stop in **SEMUR EN AUXOIS**, a medieval city surrounded by impressive walls. Still in Burgundy, we will have time for lunch and a stroll in **VEZELAY**, one of France's most beautiful villages, its immense basilica was one of the starting points of the Way of St James. In the afternoon we continue on our way to **PARIS**. Arrival mid-afternoon. **Arrival and end of services.** Our guide will drop you off at the agreed point.

Day 01 . Paris- Rouen- Arromanches- Caen.-

Welcome to your Europamundo Trip Style!!!

The information about the meeting place and start time of your circuit can be found on your voucher.

Early departure from Paris, travelling towards **Normandy**, making a stop in **GIVERNY**. We will visit **Monet's House and its impressive gardens (entrance included)**; we talk about Impressionist art, which has its birthplace in Normandy. The journey continues to **ROUEN**, the capital of Normandy with its medieval streets and cathedral. Here we have time for a stroll and to have lunch. this we continue to the Loire Valley, visiting **TOURS**, the regional capital on the banks of the Loire River, time for a stroll and to take lunch. In the afternoon we will visit the **CHATEAU DE VILLANDRY**, famous for its gardens and flowers (**entrance to the gardens included**). Journey on to **AMBOISE**, a city with a very interesting medieval quarter. Dinner included.

#### Day 04 . Amboise- Chenonceau- Chambord- Argenton- Limoges.-

A day to learn more about the Loire region. First a stroll through **Amboise** in the early hours to the Clos Lucé mansion where Leonardo da Vinci spent the last 3 years of his life. Exploring the Loire region in a little more depth, we visit **CHENONCEAU CASTLE (entrance included)**, built like a bridge over the River Cher. We continue to **CHAMBORD**, the largest castle of Loire (**entrance to the park included**). We will then travel to the centre of France, making a stop for coffee in **ARGENTON SUR CREUSE**, a small medieval town on the banks of the Creuse River. We continue to **LIMOGES**, a city known for its porcelain, where we recommend to take a stroll in the centre to see its cathedral.

#### Day 05 . Limoges- Lascaux- Sarlat- Beynac- Rocamadour.-

We will leave Limoges for the Dordogne. Few regions contain so many villages full of charm and unforgettable scenery. We arrive at **LASCAUX**, where we include admission to the museum and replica of the caves, here we will learn about the site's prehistory with the magnificent cave paintings. After that we see **SARLAT**, a world heritage town with an incredibly well-preserved Renaissance historic centre, where there will be time to stroll and have lunch. In **BEYNAC** we see a **medieval castle** overlooking the river (**admission included**). **ROCAMADOUR**, a beautiful medieval village with an important sanctuary "hung" over a ravine; we suggest you walk down the Via Crucis and come back up with the lift. **Dinner included.**

#### Day 06 . Rocamadour- Padirac- Collonges la Rouge- St. Emilion- Bordeaux.-

We will go to the impressive **PADIRAC** caves, where we include a **boat ride on the river, 75 metres underground**. A stop at **COLLONGE LA ROUGE**, a very picturesque village built with red stone on the Way of St James. Time for lunch. After lunch we travel to **ST. EMILION**, at the heart of the Bordeaux wine producing region. Time for a stroll. **BORDEAUX**, arrival at the end of the afternoon.

**NB:** The caves may be closed in the winter season, from November on, or due to weather conditions.

#### Day 07 . Bordeaux- Lourdes.-

The entire centre of Bordeaux has been declared a world heritage site. You will be amazed by the "water mirror" and have time for a stroll through the old town with its pedestrian streets and 11th century cathedral. We **include admission** (free visit with audio-guide in English or French) to the **CITE DU VIN**, an impressive interactive museum that retells the history of wine and its production; **wine tasting included** at the viewpoint over Bordeaux.



After, you will have free time to stroll and have lunch on the banks of the Garonne River, an area full of small restaurants. We continue on our way towards the Pyrenees, arriving to **LOURDES** in the mid-afternoon. We have time to see the sanctuary (we recommend attending the candle procession). **Dinner included.**



### Day 01 . Edinburgh- South Queensferry- Saint Andrews- Loch Ness- Inverness.-

Welcome to your Europamundo Trip Style!!!

The information about the meeting place and start time of your circuit can be found on your voucher.

We will leave Edinburgh and cross the iconic suspension bridge over the Firth of Forth towards the Scottish Highlands. After a brief photo stop at **South Queensferry** to take a visual souvenir of the three bridges that cross the estuary, we will head to **SAINT ANDREWS**, a beautiful university town known as "home of golf". In St. Andrews we will visit the ruins of its cathedral founded in the XII century, one of the largest in Great Britain and whose remains will give us an idea of how majestic it was in the Middle Ages. Along the cliffs and a short distance from the sea, we will find **Saint Andrews Castle**. We will visit it (**entrance fee included**) to discover its tunnels and dungeons losing track of time.



In the afternoon, we will head to **Loch Ness**, Scotland's most famous lake, home to Nessie. We will enjoy the beautiful views of the huge and mysterious loch (a Gaelic word for "lake") until we reach the small village of **DRUMNADROCHIT** where we will take a pleasant stroll.

We will continue our route to the capital of the Highlands, **INVERNESS**. Here, we will enjoy the pleasant views of the banks of the River Ness with its castle dominating the city. Accommodation.

## Day 02 Inverness - Dunrobin Castle - Scrabster- Stromess - Orkney Islands -Kirkwall.-

We will leave Inverness to head north and visit one of the most impressive castles in Scotland, **Dunrobin Castle (entrance fee included)**. It is the official residence of the Earl of Sutherland. It was originally built in the Middle Ages although it has undergone several alterations over the years. Its 189 rooms make it one of the biggest castles in the country.

From there we will be heading towards **JOHN O' GROATS**, the most northerly town in Britain from where, we will **travel by ferry to the Orkney Islands**, an archipelago of 70 islands of which only 20 are inhabited. We will be surprised by its cliffs, the diversity of birds and, if we are lucky enough, we will be able to see seals in the water. Due to its proximity to Norway, the islands have a strong Viking legacy. It is believed that the Vikings landed there in the VIII century and in a short time their culture spread throughout the Orkney and Shetland Islands.

To end our day, we will reach the capital of the archipelago, **KIRKWALL**, a bustling city. The impressive St. Magnus Cathedral, built in red sandstone with impressive stained-glass windows, is its main monument. Accommodation.

## Day 03 . Kirkwall Orkney Islands- Maeshowe - Skara Brae - Ring of Brodgar- Stromness-- Yesnaby - Italian Chapel-- Kirkwall.-


Today we will live an unforgettable experience visiting several of **the Orkney Islands**, we will cross from one island to another through the old Churchill Barriers built to prevent the passage of German submarines during World War II but used as roads nowadays. We will discover **the burial chamber of Maeshowe (entrance fee included)**, one of the largest Neolithic burial mounds in Europe. Inside it, we will find the largest Viking inscriptions and remains to be found outside Scandinavia. After that, we will visit an ancient and mysterious place: **the Neolithic settlement of Skara Brae (entrance fee included)**, an extensive and practically intact settlement located in the bay of Skail. From there, we will head to **the Ring of Brodgar**, a cromlech (or stone circle) built around 2500 B.C. Maeshowe, Skara Brae and the Ring of Brodgar have been declared UNESCO World Heritage Sites.

Back in **KIRKWALL**, we will **visit its distillery (entrance fee included)**. Here, one of Scotland's finest whiskies is produced: The famous Highland Park which has a Viking soul. We will now head to **STROMNESS**, a beautiful fishing village where we will be able to taste its famous fish-based gastronomy.

After lunch, we will discover **the spectacular cliffs of Yesnaby**, which will take your breath away. We will then make a short stop at the charming **little Italian Chapel**, built from recycled materials by Italian prisoners of war captured in Africa during World War II.

Return to KIRKWALL and accommodation.

#### Day 04 . Kirkwall – Thurso – Smoo Cave – Durness – Ardvreck Castle – Ullapool.-

Today we will leave the Orkney Islands, taking **the ferry to THURSO** where we will have some time to stroll through its harbour.

Our route today through the northern coast of Scotland will allow us to enjoy some of the most impressive landscapes in our trip. We will stop at **Smoo Cave**, a huge cavern made by the sea where pirates used to hide in the past. We will also visit **DURNESS**, a charming village at the top of a cliff with an easy access to a beach of cold waters. We will stop here to have lunch.

In the afternoon, on our way to Ullapool, we will stop briefly to take a picture of **the ruins of Ardvreck Castle**. The structure was built by Clan MacLeod during the XVI century and there are many legends and stories about it which our guide will surely tell us. We will arrive to ULLAPOOL and to our accommodation. Ullapool is a small town created in the XVIII century as a herring fishing port.

#### Day 05 . Ullapool – Isle of Skye- Portree.-

Today we will head south to the famous **ISLE OF SKYE** also known as the Fairy Isle because of its breathtaking scenery and hidden spots. Be prepared, this place sums up all the magic of Scotland. We will see the natural wonder known as **Kilt Rock**, an impressive waterfall on a majestic cliff. Its name comes from the resemblance of the cliffs to the famous Scottish kilt. After that, we will discover **the Fairy Glen**, a beautiful valley made up of dozens of miniature green hills, a place of myths, legends and magical creatures. Further west we'll find **Neist Point**, a lighthouse on a spit of land mostly surrounded by the sea, one of the most photographed places in Scotland.

Accommodation in **PORTREE**, which in Gaelic means “Port of the King”, a charming and colourful village.

### Day 06 . Portree – Armadale – Mallaig – Glenfinnan – Fort William – Oban .-

First thing in the morning, we will leave Skye. From the town of **ARMADALE**, in the southern part of the isle, we will take a **ferry** to Mallaig on the mainland. Travelling along the iconic Road of the Isles we will stop briefly in **Glenfinnan**, which viaduct will look familiar, as it has been used frequently in Harry Potter films. After that, we continue our journey to **FORT WILLIAM**, a former military fort. The city has become famous because it is at the foot of the highest mountain in the United Kingdom, Ben Nevis, which rises to a height of 1,344 metres. After some time to stroll around Fort William, we will continue to **OBAN**, a lively fishing village where we will stay for the night. Accommodation.

### Day 07 . Oban – Glasgow – Edinburgh.-

At this point in our tour, we are coming to the end of it. After some time to stroll around Oban, we will head to **GLASGOW**, Scotland’s second city, but its largest in size and population. With our local guide, we will make a panoramic tour where we will discover a city full of contrasts. For more than a century, Glasgow was considered “the engine of Europe” and the second city of the British Empire for the amount of industry and wealth it housed. Today, it is a dynamic, touristic, commercial city, home to renowned artists and rock bands such as Texas or Franz Ferdinand. Glasgow is one of the European capitals of architecture, with buildings that are unique in the world. We will tour the city along the banks of the River Clyde, see the impressive Mosque, the auditorium area, the City Chambers in George Square and visit (**entrance fee included**) the XII century **St. Mungo’s Cathedral**.

After some time to enjoy Glasgow, we will have a transfer to Edinburgh. Our guide will take you to the airport for your return flight or take you to the point of your choice if you are continuing your holiday.

### Day 01 . Edinburgh.-

**Welcome to your Europamundo Trip Style!!!**

The information about the meeting place and start time of your circuit can be found on your voucher.

We will leave Edinburgh to visit the south-eastern region of Scotland called **the Borders**. ### Day 01 . Edinburgh.-

### Day 01 . Inverness- Glen Ord- Assynt- Ardvreck Castle- Ullapool.-

We leave Inverness, capital of the Highlands, to visit **Glen Ord Distillery**. This distillery produces the famous whisky Singleton. After the visit and the tasting **(included)**, we continue our trip to the region of Assynt, famous for its impressive mountain landscapes. In our way, we find the Ardvreck Castle ruins, one of the most picturesque in Scotland. This castle was the stage of the fights involving the Marquess of Montrose and McLeod and McKenzie 's clans There are many stories and legends around it.

We arrive then to **ULLAPOOL**, fishing village created during the mid-19th century. Its pubs serve excellent seafood and it is easy to find live Scottish folk music. Accommodation.

## Day 02 . Ullapool – Stornoway /Isle of Lewis – Calanais - Dun Carloway -Isle of Harris.-

We take the morning **ferry** from Ullapool to **STORNOWAY**, capital of **the Isle of Lewis**. This island is the biggest of the Outer Hebrides. From there we travel to visit **the Standing Stones of Calanais**. This cross-shaped monument was erected 5,000 years ago, dating before the famous Stonehenge monument in England. Very early in the morning we will board a new **ferry**. This time we are heading to Uig in **the Isle of Skye**. **Skye has been called the Fairy Isle** and it is the most famous among the Hebrides. 

### Day 05 . Isle of Mull – Isle of Staffa- Isle of Iona – Oban.-

We leave Mull to board a smaller boat that allows us to visit, weather permitting, the impressive **Isle of Staffa**, an island formed by basalt columns. This is a perfect place to connect with unspoilt nature. We find there **Fingal's Cave**, hiding place of one of the giants who, according to the legend, built the famous Giant's Causeway in Ireland.

We star an **Edinburgh City tou** with our guide. This city is known as the “North-ern Athens” because of the classical style of its buildings. A true highlight is the Royal Mile, the Old Town’s axis, an avenue created by several streets whose dark closes will allow us to understand the legends that inspired Stevenson’s The Strange Case of Doctor Jekyll and Mr. Hyde. We will visit as well, Grassmarket Square, full of pubs, or the New Town, built in the 18th century.

During our walk, **several places related to Harry Potter will be visited:** the Elephant House Cafe where J.K. Rowling began to write the first novel or the luxurious Hotel Balmoral, where she finished the last one, “Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows”; Greyfriars Kirkyard, where we will find Tom Riddle’s and McGonagall’s graves; the famous Victoria Street, whose charming shops inspired Diagon Alley, and the Meadows, home to the Holyrood Hippogriffs Socie-

ty, organiser of Quidditch Competitions some days of the weeks. We will spend the rest of our day discovering the beautiful city of Edinburgh, thanks to the tips our guide will give us.

### Day 02 . Edinburgh – Borders – Alnwick Castle - Kelso- Edinburgh.-

The day will start by travelling to **the Borders**, a name that reminds us that this is border region with England. For centuries both nations have fought in these lands. We will drive south along the scenic Northumberland coastal road to **Alnwick Castle (entrance fee included)**. 

### Day 01 . Dublin- Tara Hill- Bru Na Boinne- Belfast.-

**Welcome to your Europamundo Trip Style!!!**

The information about the meeting place and start time of your circuit can be found on your voucher.

Departure from Dublin, the capital of the Republic of Ireland, heading North. We will visit **Hill of Tara (entrance included)**, an important place of worship and coveted centre of power throughout history, full of myths and legends that our guide will reveal to us.

We continue our route stopping at **Bru Na Boinne** to admire the largest collection of megalithic art in Western Europe, with more than 90 monuments. The three most impressive and famous sites in the valley are Newgrange, Knowth and Dowth. **Entrance included** to one of these spectacular monuments.

Afterward, we proceed to **BELFAST**, the capital of Northern Ireland and one of the most complete cities in Ireland, where we will enjoy a panoramic **tour** accompanied by our tour leader to discover its perfect blend of culture, history,

We keep on our journey to visit one of the most unique and famous geological formations of the Emerald Isle and which has been declared a World Heritage Site, **the Giant 's Causeway (entrance included)**. Formed by more than 40,000 basalt columns that were created some 60 million years ago. According to Irish mythology, its origin dates back to a battle between two giants of Ireland and Scotland, Finn y Bannandonder.

After lunch, we head to the ruins of the 12th century **Dunluce Castle (Entrance included)**, an Irish National Heritage Site. The remains of this fortress are still impressive as it stands between the rocks and cliff and has been featured in some of the scenes of the famous Game of Thrones series.

We continue to **LONDONDERRY**, Northern Ireland 's second city, full of pubs and life as well as being the only fully walled city on the island. Its city walls are considered to be among the most beautiful in Europe. Londonderry is a symbol of the new peace in Ulster and is the site of the first Protestant cathedral to be built on British soil after the Reformation. Accommodation.

### Day 03 . Londonderry - Fanad Head -Doe Castle - Glenveagh National Park - Donegal.-

Today we venture into Gaelic Ireland, County Donegal. This is one of the most spectacular corners of Europe, dominated by breathtaking cliffs, rugged landscapes and country roads that have been the inspiration for several Hollywood films.

We will visit **the Fanad Head Lighthouse**, considered one of the most beautiful lighthouses in the world. We will enjoy the stunning scenery of this area which is regularly frequented by whales, porpoises and dolphins.

We will discover **the Glenveagh National Park**, a valley that would fit perfectly in the "Lord of the Rings" books. Afterward, we will visit the impressive **Doe Castle (entrance included)**, a 15th century castle located in Sheephaven Bay that boasts legends of tragedy, romance... and ghosts.

We continue to **Donegal Franciscan Abbey**, the ruins of a spectacular 15th century Franciscan abbey and cemetery, chosen by the monks for its unique setting, a haven of peace by the sea.

The day ends in **DONEGAL**, the most important city in the county. We will be able to enjoy its lively and seafaring atmosphere and stroll around its emblematic Diamond Square. Accommodation.

### Day 04 . Donegal- Rossaveel – Aran Islands – Galway.-

Early departure from Donegal to the port of **Rossaveel** where we will take a boat to the nearby **ARAN ISLANDS**, one of the most beautiful and historic islands in Ireland. A group of three islands, of which we will visit the largest, **INISHMORE**, unique for both its landscapes and cliffs, as well as for its archaeological sites. The island has several Bronze and Iron Age settlements, including **Dún Aonghasa**, which, located on the cliffs, offers a marvelous view. ## Day 06 . Galway- Bunratty – Limerick – Península de Dingle – Killarney.-

We leave Galway to visit **Bunratty Folk Park (entrance included)** to enjoy the recreation of a typical 19th century Irish hamlet: its traditional thatched roofs, the interior of the fishermen's home, the blacksmith's, the school, the tearoom, the shops and the workshops, and a host of utensils typical of the period.

Afterward, we will arrive at **LIMERICK**, on the banks of the River Shannon . Its compact old centre is notable for its medieval St. Mary's Cathedral and the St. John 's Square, surrounded by Georgian terraced houses. On the banks of the river is the late 12th century King Jhon's Castle.

After lunch, we will visit the famous Dingle Peninsula, the most westerly point of Ireland. Continue to the small and charming KILLARNEY, still Ireland 's second most visited town, with its neo-Gothic St. Mary 's Cathedral and lively nightlife. Accommodation.

After several photo stops and lunch, we reach **CORK**, Ireland 's second most populous city, lively and cosmopolitan, situated on an island in the middle of the River Lee. Accommodation.

## Day 08 . Cork - Rock of Cashel - Kilkenny - Glendalough – Dublin.-

Our final day takes us to the impressive medieval ruins of **Rock of Cashel (entrance included)**. Crowned by Cormac 's Chapel, this mighty fortress in Tipperary County is filled with Viking remains. The Rock of Cashel is now regarded as one of Ireland 's most impressive historical sites, the power center of the kings of Munster, where, according to legend, St Patrick, patron saint of Ireland, baptized and converted the grandchildren of the King of Munster in the 5th century.

We then reach the pretty town of **KILKENNY**, famous for many reasons: its majestic castle shrouded by vines, bustling artisan activity, cobbled lanes and secret passages, a thousand years of history, and vibrant festivals.



After time for lunch, we will arrive at **Glendalough Monastery (entrance included)**. One of the most precious jewels of the ancient East of Ireland, built in the 6th century by St. Kevin, it is today a collection of romantic ruins, consisting of two welcoming stone arches, an impressive cemetery with tombs adorned with Celtic symbols and crosses, the priests ' house, St. Mary 's Church, and a spectacular Cathedral.

Arrive in **DUBLIN** at the end of the day. End of our services. Our guide will take you to the airport for your return flight or take you to the point of your choice if you are continuing your holiday.

We leave Belfast behind to go on to one of the most unique landscapes on the north coast of the island, the **Carrick-a-Rede suspension bridge**. It is 20-metres long and 25 metres above sea level, it offers fabulous views of the Northern Irish coast.

We continue our journey to visit one of the most unique and famous geological formations of the Emerald Isle, declared a World Heritage Site: **The Giant's Causeway (entrance included)**. Formed by more than 40,000 basalt columns that were created around 60 million years ago according to Irish mythology, and whose origin dates back to a battle between two giants of Ireland and Scotland, Finn and Bannandonner.


After lunch, we will visit the ruins of the XII century **Dunluce Castle (entrance included)**, an Irish National Heritage Site. This iconic building was considered one of the most impressive castles when it was running and has been featured in some of the scenes of the famous Game of Thrones series.

We continue to **LONDONDERRY**, Northern Ireland's second city, full of pubs and life, and the only fully walled city on the island. Its walls are considered one of the most beautiful in Europe. Londonderry is a symbol of peace in Ulster and is the site of the first Protestant cathedral built on British soil after the Reformation. Accommodation.

## Day 03 . Londonderry - Boyle Abbey - Carramore - Knocknarea - Galway.-

Departure from Londonderry heading south, to enter County Roscommon where we find **Boyle Abbey (entrance included)**, of Cistercian origin, founded in 1161. You can visit the ruins of the old church, the cloister, kitchens and the monks' cells.

We will now visit **Carramore (entrance included)**, the cemetery of megalithic tombs. We will climb the impressive Knocknarea or the queen Mab of Celtic legends to admire

from the top of the hill the magical centre and spectacular scenery of the Sligo coastline and the interior of Ireland.

Afterwards, we arrive in **GALWAY**, the largest city on the west coast and one of the most dynamic in Ireland. It has an important port, one of the most important universities in the country and a lively historic centre with live music in some famous pubs. We will take a pleasant stroll through the city centre with our tour leader. Accommodation.

#### Day 04 . Galway - Aran Islands - Galway.-

Today, we take a **boat** to the nearby **Aran Islands**, one of the most beautiful and historic islands in Ireland. It is a group of three islands, and we will visit the largest and most unique, **INISHMORE**. This is an important tourist destination, both for their landscapes and cliffs, as well as for their archaeological sites, with several Bronze and Iron Age settlements, especially Dún Aonghasa, located on the cliffs which offers a wonderful view. We also find monastic areas, such as the enclosure known as the Seven Churches, or different hermitages used for those looking for a refugee on these islands.

Return to **GALWAY** and accommodation.

## Day 05 . Galway - Poul nabrone - Cliffs of Moher - Craggaunowen - Limerick - Adare - Killarney.-

We leave Galway heading south towards County Clare where we will visit one of the most important megalithic monuments in Europe **Poul nabrone Dolmen**, a large tomb from the Neolithic period.

We will continue our journey to **the famous Cliffs of Moher (entrance included)**, one of the most impressive and visited natural formations in the world, with an extension of 8 km and more than 320 million years old. We will then drive to **Craggaunowen (entrance included)**, a fortified settlement which is now an open-air archaeological museum that allows an interactive experience to the visitors about the way of life during the Bronze Age in Ireland.

After this, we will arrive in **LIMERICK**, situated on the banks of the River Shannon. Its compact old town is dominated by the medieval St Mary's Cathedral and St John's Square, surrounded by Georgian terraced houses. On the banks of the river is the late XII century King John's Castle.

We will then visit the small village of **ADARE**, considered one of the Ireland's prettiest villages and a designated Heritage Town. Accompanied by our tour leader, we will visit its traditional architecture, its picturesque stone houses with thatched roofs that maintain their medieval appearance.

We will continue to the small and charming **KILLARNEY**, Ireland's second most visited where its neo-Gothic St. Mary's Cathedral and lively nightlife stand out. Accommodation.

## Day 06 . Killarney - Rock of Cashel - Kilkenny - Glendalough - Dublin.-

During our last day in Ireland's beautiful land, we will visit the impressive medieval **ruins of Rock of Cashel (entrance included)**. Crowned by Cormac's Chapel, this mighty fortress in Tipperary County is full of Viking remains. The Rock of Cashel is now considered one of Ireland's most impressive historic sites and a jewel of the Middle Ages in Ireland.

We then reach the pretty town of **KILKENNY**, famous for many things: its majestic vine-shrouded castle, bustling artisan activity, cobbled lanes and secret passages, a thousand years of history and vibrant festivals. Close to the city centre is Kilkenny Castle, which dates back to the XII century and was the residence of the Butler family.

After lunch, we arrive at **Glendalough Monastery (entrance included)**, one of the most precious jewels of Ireland's ancient east, built in the VI century by St. Kevin. Today, it is a collection of romantic ruins, consisting of two welcoming stone arches, an impressive cemetery with tombs decorated with Celtic symbols and crosses, the priests' house, St. Mary's Church and a spectacular Cathedral.

Arrival in **DUBLIN** at the end of the day.


